We have put together some information we would like you to know about what it means to teach in a **Rights Respecting School**.



- We **learn about rights** in our school, to help you understand this we have included a **Pocket Book of Rights** in your information pack. The pocketbook explains all the promises made to children by the UK government when they signed up to the UNCRRC.
- As an adult working in our school you are a **DUTYBEARER**. That means you must help the **RIGHTS HOLDERS (us the pupils!)** get access to our rights.
- Every classroom has a **Classroom Charter** displayed that all the pupils and staff in the school have agreed to. Please take a few minutes to look at the Class Charter in the classroom where you are based for the day.
- Our school is a **community**, we all care about and look out for each other.
- It is very important that staff and pupils talk to each other in a **Rights Respecting** way. This means explaining things carefully, having good manners, not raising our voices and disagreeing respectfully with each other.
- **We care about the environment**; in each classroom room you are in you will find a recycling bin. Please make sure you put your rubbish in the right bin!
