Continuous learning at home for this half term:

Maths

- Can you spot any numbers whilst out and about?
- Practice writing numbers in words from 0 to 50/100
- Can you count in multiples of 2, 5 or 10?
- Practice finding pairs of numbers to total 10, 20 or 100
- Spend some time on numbots and TT rockstars (logins in reading journals)

Reading

- Can you find and read a story, a set of instructions, a comic?
- Retell stories using key language- this can be verbally or through story maps

Writing Focus:

This week the children will be beginning their learning focusing on the book "Somebody Swallowed Stanley". They will be creating their own story map and also innovating the story.

Maths Focus:

In Maths some children focusing on fractions of amounts and some children will be continuing their learning on number and place value but this week they will focus on number bonds.

A plea from us:

Art this half term will focus on sculpture using recycled materials. Recently bottles have been requested but we would like to also include other 'junk modelling' materials Things that could be used are:

- Bottle tops
- Egg cartons
- Straws
- Yoghurt pots (clean and dry)
- Toilet roll tubes
