Continuous learning at home for this half term:

Maths • Can you spot any numbers whilst out and about? • Practice writing numbers in words from 0 to 50/100 • Can you count in multiples of 2, 5 or 10? • Practice finding pairs of numbers to total 10, 20 or 100 • Spend some time on numbots and TT rockstars (logins in reading journals)	Reading • Can you find and read a story, a set of instructions, a comic? • Retell stories using key language- this can be verbally or through story maps
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Writing Focus:

After the children have written their own verse to the Hippocrump, they will be exploring non-chronological reports. Using this genre of writing, the children will create a mythical animal by combining two.

Maths Focus:

During the week, some children will be revisiting multiplication and division, thinking about the strategies used. Some children will be focusing on geometry, specifically position and direction.

Important information...

For PE, KS1 will be going outside for as much of the year as possible. Please ensure your child has a winter PE kit consisting of navy blue jumper / hoody and jogging bottoms / leggings and trainers alongside their indoor / summer PE kit of red shorts & white t-shirt. Thank you!
