Continuous learning at home for this half term:

Maths

- Practice writing numbers in words from 0 to 50/100
- Can you draw an empty number line and estimate where different numbers will go on it?
- Can you count in multiples of 2, 5 or 10?
- Practice finding pairs of numbers to total 10, 20 or 100
- Spend some time on Numbots and TT rockstars (logins in reading journals)

Reading

- Sit and snuggle with your favourite book and try and discuss what the characters were doing in it
- Can you find and read a story, a set of instructions, a comic?
- Retell stories using key language- this can be verbally or through story maps

Writing Focus:

Continuing on from last week, the children will be creating their own friendship potion, thinking about the steps required to do this. They will then apply their learning and write up their instructions.

Maths Focus:

Following on from last week, we will be continuing to look at addition. The children will use concrete and pictorial representations to do this, before applying their understanding to fluency and reasoning.

Important information...

For PE, KS1 will be going outside for as much of the year as possible. Please ensure your child has a winter PE kit consisting of navy blue jumper / hoody and jogging bottoms / leggings and trainers alongside their indoor / summer PE kit of red shorts & white t-shirt. Thank you!
